

RIVISTA DI FILOSOFIA NEO-SCOLASTICA GUIDELINES

The articles must be written in Italian, English, French, German or Spanish.
Authors are kindly requested to follow the style sheet here below.

Manuscripts should contain the following information:

- Title Page
- Author
- Abstract, and Key words
- Article Text

Author(s)

Authors full name should be indicated as well as their institutional affiliation with complete address and email address.

Abstract and Key words

The article should be followed by an English abstract (no more than 150 words). The abstract should summarize results, topics discussed, and main conclusions, and should be followed by three to five key words or phrases separated by comma.

Article Text

- **Headings.** The main body of the article should be divided by appropriate numbered section (1, 2, 3) and subsection (1.1., 1.2.) headings. Sections and subsections can have a title.
- **Abbreviations.** Abbreviations should be defined at first mention and used consistently thereafter. The terms should first be written out in full followed by their abbreviation in parenthesis, preferably in capitals without full stops. The same holds also for logical symbols.
- **Footnotes.** Footnotes should be placed at the bottom of the page to which they refer.

Reference Citations

NB: There is no final reference section: every reference should be placed in footnote.
References should be given in a standard form, as in the following examples:

Volumes

Essays/chapters in books

For indicate the curatorship please use the abbreviation in the volume's original language of publication: edited by, ed., éd., hrsg.

Ancient authors; Greek and Latin texts

- ARISTOTLE, *Phys.*, 194 a 21. Or: THOMAS, *S. Th.*, q. 14, a. 1.
- For Greek, please use UNICODE characters. (In Word, click on «Symbol» in the tab «Insert», then on «More symbols» and in the drop-down menu «Subset», select «Greek» or «Extended Greek».)

Tables, figures and graphs

Tables, Figures and graphs should fit within the specified text area (no more than 12,5 x 19,5 cm.).

- **Tables.** Tables should be numbered consecutively in Arabic numerals following the order in which they are cited. Therefore, each table must be cited in the text. In page layout tables should be placed in sequence as close as possible to their first citation. Each table must have a brief descriptive title:
Table 1 - *Mean Performance Scores of Students With Different College Majors*

- **Figures and Graphs.** Each figure must have a figure caption, including the figure number:

Fig. 1 - *Fluctuation of real wages and unemployment*

Figures are numbered consecutively, using Arabic numerals, and must be cited in the text. Each figure must be keyed into the text as Fig. 1, Fig. 2 etc. and placed as close as possible to its first citation.

Figures and graphs should be attached to the text in an open file format and will be published exclusively in black and white. Light grey value shadings as well as fine hairlines should be avoided as they have the tendency to fade in print.

Editorial style

In order to avoid common problems of style:

1. Use quotation marks
 - when a standard term is used in a nonstandard way please use italics.
 - to indicate the beginning and ending of a direct quotation: «nnn».
 - in case of a quotation within another quotation: «mmm: "nnn"».
2. Italics may be used only sparingly for words in foreign languages, as well as to introduce and emphasize important terms.
